This course is being taught in the HyFlex format, meaning that you have a choice of completing it live on campus, live online, or asynchronously right here. You can even decide session by session how you want to attend and participate. For instance, students in the live meeting may do a group poll, but asynchronous students will have an individual quiz. Students who attend live may carry out a verbal discussion while taking notes, but asynchronous online students may need to enter individual responses into the discussion board. Please know that I keep equity in mind as I design the course activities and assessments.

About Course Recordings

If you attend class on campus, you will be seen on video by students participating live online via Zoom. Meeting Recordings may be provided through the Panopto link, or your instructor may provide individual links to recordings within your course modules. If you are participating live online, your image might be projected onto a screen in the classroom. Lectures might be recorded and placed into the Blackboard classroom for all students, including asynchronous students, to view later. FERPA regulations protect those recordings. Only students enrolled in this class can view the class recordings and only for the duration of the course. Please do not share or post these recordings elsewhere.
